

Types of Allergies

Allergy Management

Airborne

Small particles in the air

- Dust
- Pollen
- Dander

Symptoms are often seasonal, and can sometimes be managed with anti-histamine medications and regular bathing.

Food

The most common food allergies are:

- Beef
- Dairy
- Wheat

But others are possible

It can take 8 to 12 weeks for symptoms to subside after your pet stops getting the food they are allergic to, and even a few crumbs from under the table can trigger them. Talk with your veterinarian about the best strategy for a food trial.

Contact

Anything that touches your pet's skin. Could include:

- · Bedding material
- Cleaning Chemicals
- Grass
- · Many Others

It is best to avoid whatever your pet is allergic to, but if that isn't possible, there are medications that can help relieve symptoms. Regular bathing may also help.

Remember: Always check with your veterinarian before starting or changing any medications.
