THE RISKS

As many as 70-80% of dogs and cats develop dental disease by the age of 3 years old. Dental disease is caused by bacteria and plaque build up on teeth and gums. This bacteria causes bad breath, pain, and gingivitis. Those same bacteria also travel through your pet's bloodstream to the heart, lungs, liver and kidneys.

THE SYMPTOMS

Dogs and cats do not often reveal obvious signs of pain or illness. Animals tend to hide their symptoms of pain and illness to maintain pack hierarchy and to decrease predator concerns. Pet owners are often surprised when their pets "act like he did years ago," after they have a professional dental cleaning.

Check your pet's teeth on a regular basis, making sure to look all the way back to their molars. Are the teeth pearly white with normal pink gums, or are they yellow, green, or brown? Are the gums swollen, red, or bleeding? These are all symptoms of plaque, tartar, gingivitis, or more serious, periodontal disease. If left untreated, these problems can be painful, lead to loss of appetite, excessive drooling, and loose teeth.
