AGE IS NOT A DISEASE

Many clients believe that their pets are slowing down due to simple "old age." There are many conditions that can cause cats to have less than fulfilling lives. Some of these conditions can be managed or possibly even corrected.

SIMPLE SENIOR RECOMMENDATIONS:

-Semi-annual physical exam including cardiac, ocular, skin, abdominal, dental, and orthopedic evaluation. Discussion could also include weight management and arthritis monitoring.

-Yearly senior screening blood panel and urinalysis.

-Rabies vaccination once every 3 years

-FVRCP vaccination once every 3-5years.



*Obesity decreases life expectancy by an average of 2 years. *95% of all cats have evidence of arthritis on xrays but most have never had symptoms of lameness or obvious pain.
